There is a full kitchen which includes refrigerator, stove and microwave. The shop will remain open during retreat hours for our quilters.

No meals are provided so please plan accordingly. There is a Subway and Hardees nearby.

Attendance is limited to 18 quilters per day to ensure plenty of space in the work room. Registration will be accepted on a first come/first serve basis for paid members until filled. We will maintain a waiting list.

TIP CORNER

Wrap Around Binding

 Trim Away Batting from Quilt



Cut backing to square up the edges to 1.5" on all four sides.



3. It will look like this.



 Fold in half way and steam press all four sides



Then, fold in the other half of the backing and steam press all four sides in place.



For best results use your walking foot for final stitching in place.



President's Corner

Last month's meeting was truly a hot July night, but we had a cool time at the Ames Quilt Guild meeting. We celebrated with a PowerPoint™ presentation showing the quilt making work teams and the progression in making the Sew-In quilts. I am so very pleased with the number of people who participated in the planning and assembling of the quilts for Sleep in Heavenly Peace. There was a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 7 members sewing at one time; average attendance was 10. The PowerPoint presentation truly showed how many hands worked together at the first ever Charity Quilt "Sew-In" on July 12, 2023 at the Briardale Square Community Room.



The goal was to make as many 70"X90" quilt tops in one day as possible using 8 ½ inch strips and the "jelly roll" concept. It took planning, organization, and willing workers. The room was set up with several stations for sorting, cutting, pressing, sewing, and bundling tops and backings together. The results were 9 quilt tops and 5 quilt backs bundled together for quilting. Several volunteers took fabric home to sew and brought 4 more sewn tops to AQG for quilting. After that event, 6 boxes of fabric were donated to the Gilbert Lutheran Church where they make quilts for an international charity.

At our July meeting, all the quilted tops were taken home by volunteers who will bind them. Rumor has it that Ames will have its own chapter for Sleep In Heavenly Peace later this fall. With this donation, they will have a very good supply of quilts to give with each bed delivered. Thank you all! I am proud of you!

From the Quilting Bookworm



And now for something a little different. In 2009 lowa quilters were asked to create "county" quilt block designs to be placed on the exterior of Jacobson Exhibition Center on the lowa State Fair grounds. 10 years later these designs were turned into a book, Quilt Blocks of the lowa State Fair. It is currently being sold at the Fabric and Threads exhibition in the Varied Industries building, among other places. As requested, all the designs are linear geometrics, mostly worked in bright colors. In addition to a picture,

each pattern page includes a cutting chart and concise, but clear block assembly instructions (mostly joining squares, rectangles and/or triangles). Template or foundation piecing patterns are included for the few more advanced patterns that call for them. There are also a couple of sample quilt layouts (no, they don't use all 102 blocks). Please consider supporting Fabric and Threads. This book is not yet in the guild library, but it will be as soon as I drop it off.

Stash Dispersal by Vice-President, Kathy Jones

As you look over your quilting "stash", you may realize that there is no way that you could ever finish enough projects to use up everything you have collected over the years. Have you thought about what to tell your family to do with your fabric, your batting, sewing machines, and sewing supplies?

During my time as Iowa Coordinator for Quilts of Valor, I have received many contacts from children of quilters who are in the process of gifting quilting resources to groups in a manner that is consistent with what the quilter specified or would have wanted. After determining the location of the donation, I find the nearest QOV group and determine whether they would be willing to meet with the family member and accept a donation.

As a result of one such contact in late July, I corresponded with a family member of an Ankeny quilter. Her task at that time was to rehome multiple 8-foot-long rolls of batting. After discussion with Phyllis, my husband and I drove to Ankeny to pick up the batting. We were more than a bit shocked at the size of the rolls, and our truck bed was over-filled with three large rolls and one smaller roll of batting. With the concurrence of the donating family, the batting will be used for Quilts of Valor, Sleep in Heavenly Peace, and for Lutheran World Relief quilts (Gilbert Lutheran Church project).

Thank you so much to a fellow quilter whom we will never know, but whose gifts will help support our Sleep in Heavenly Peace and Quilts of Valor initiatives. We may also hear more from this family as they begin the process of gifting a large quantity of fabric bolts.

A brief reminder – it's never too early to start thinking about how you would want your quilting fabric and supplies to be rehomed if you are no longer able to quilt.
