- Donations are always welcome: heavy plastic netting from cuties or other fruits, jean pockets, batting, crocheted small squares or caterpillars; purchased fidgets (i.e., from Dollar Tree—bath mitts, ponytail holders, small socks or mittens
- Sew quilt tops from fabric scraps, leftover quilt blocks, fabrics with varied textures; appropriate sizes are anywhere from that of a placemat (14"X18") to that of a small activity mat, (24"X24")
- Sew quilt bases (the quilt top and backing fabric with batting in-between); sizes listed above


Meet Betty Baker AQG Programs
